## CALLING PROCEDURES

#### Calling

- Call sign of station being called is always spoken first.
- Followed by the words "THIS IS"
- Call sign of the station calling

Replying

- Call sign of station calling
- Followed by the words 'THIS IS"
- Call sign of station being called
- "GO AHEAD"

## CALLING PROCEDURE (cont)

General Call – All Stations Multiple Station Call Call signs called in order Corrections Say word "CORRECTION" after mistake and say the corrected information If not sure who's calling "say station calling, your call sign

## CALLING PROCEDURE (cont)

Distress Signal

 "MAYDAY" repeat 3 times use in imminent danger

Urgency Message

 "PAN PAN" repeat 3 times use for urgent message

Phonetic Alphabet (alpha....zulu)

# MESSAGE HANDLING PROCEDURES

Operator should: Deliver the radio message clearly Plan message before transmitting - Listen before transmitting to avoid interference with other transmissions Four parts of the message - The call-up - The reply – The message The acknowledgement or ending
